LED Christmas lights are the best choice to save money on your holiday lighting bill. LEDs are:

Cheaper: They consume far less energy than incandescent lights, costing just cents to run for an entire holiday season

Safer: LEDs are cool to the touch, unlike incandescent lighting, reducing the fire hazard when strung on a tree. They are also made of epoxy lenses instead of glass, so little fingers are protected from breakage.

Stress-free: Up to 25 strings of LEDs can be plugged into one another without overloading a standard electric outlet. LED lights also last much longer than other types, meaning you can use them for many holiday seasons to come.

CONSERVATION TIPS
