
The Department of Energy states that windows can be responsible for 25 to 30 percent of your home's heating and cooling energy use. Single-pane, or inefficient windows, allow heat to easily enter your home in the summer or escape from your home during the winter. To combat this wasted energy, consider investing in new Energy Star®-rated windows for your home. Your project could qualify for a 10 to 25 percent rebate of the total project cost through BTU's SmartHOME Program.

To qualify, homeowners must:

- Change out old, inefficient windows and replace them with Energy Star®-rated windows, certified for our area of Texas.
- Fill out an application online, complete with before and after pictures of the project.
- The project must take place on a permanent, existing residential structure, and must occur within the current fiscal year (October 1 through September 30 each year).

CONSERVATION TIPS

Energy Conservation Tip:

By lowering the water heater temperature from 140 degrees to 120, you can save more than 10 percent on your water heating bill.





Water Conservation Tip:

To help prevent water leaks due to ruptured water pipes in cold weather conditions, wrap outdoor pipes and spigots with insulation. Water expands as it gets close to freezing temperatures, causing increased pressure inside the pipe. Ruptures in the pipe can occur when the pressure becomes too high for the pipe to contain. Also, locate the main water shut-off valve and know how to use it.
