CONSIDER UTILITIES WHEN LANDSCAPE PLANNING



Planting trees and shrubs can make our homes, businesses, and communities more aesthetically pleasing. However, landscaping can become a dangerous and costly problem if the plant and site selection fails to consider their effects on utility lines and equipment.

High winds and ice can cause tree limbs to fall on power lines, causing outages or knocking down power lines. To keep these instances to a minimum, BTU spends hundreds of thousands of dollars annually on pruning or removing branches, trees, and shrubs that can potentially damage power lines or interfere with access to utility equipment.

Customers can do their part by planting trees and shrubs away from overhead utility lines, underground lines, and ground-level transformers. A good recommendation is to determine the maximum mature height of the tree or bush, and make sure it is a minimum of 20 feet away from overhead power lines.

For underground utilities, avoid planting any trees or tall shrubs along the service line. Call 811 to have your underground utility lines marked at least two days before digging. Also, don't block access to utility equipment. Short shrubs and flower beds should be placed so that their pruned edges are at least one foot away from ground-mounted transformer pads and never directly in front of the transformer doors.

In order to provide our customers with consistently high reliability, BTU contracts with certified crews to trim trees within the utility right-of-way on a four- to five-year trim cycle. BTU strives to balance the challenge of long-term vegetation clearance with preserving the aesthetic value of your trees.
