Tip 2: Setting your Thermostat

Set the thermostat no higher than 68°F while you are at home, and even lower while you are sleeping or away from home. If you have a heat pump, avoid turning the thermostat up by more than two degrees at a time to prevent activating auxiliary heat strips that use a great deal of energy.



Tip 3: Insulating

Insulation is the home's primary defense against heat loss. Make sure you have adequate insulation in your attic and exterior walls. If you add insulation, you may qualify for BTU's SmartHOME program.

Tip 4: Utilizing the sun

Utilize the sun's radiant heat by opening the drapes to let the sunlight warm your home. Make sure to close the drapes when the sun goes down to help keep the chill out.





Used Oil & Tire Recycling Center OPENS FOR BRYAN RESIDENTS

The City of Bryan's used oil and tire recycling center at **1111 Waco St.** opened on February 1, which allows Bryan residents to properly dispose of used oil, filters, cooking grease and tires from residential use.

Tires and oils generated from commercial or industrial use will not be accepted.

This facility is manned by staff and operates from 8 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Monday through Friday, and 8 a.m. to noon on Saturday.

Residents should enter on Waco Street and remain in their vehicle until an attendant is able to assist. You may be required to show proof that you are a Bryan resident/solid waste residential customer (such as your BTU bill or driver's license).



Bring up to 8 used tires per visit, which will be unloaded and collected by city staff. Accepted materials include used passenger, light and medium duty tires (on or off rim). (Tractor-trailer, heavy equipment or tires generated from commercial or industrial use will not be accepted.)

USED OIL:

Bring up to 5 gallons of used motor oils, filters and cooking oils/grease per visit. Residents will be directed to dispose of their oil at the do-it-yourself oil recycling center. (Restaurant cooking oils, used oils/filters from mechanic shops and industrial oils will not be accepted.)





CONSERVATION TIPS

Energy Conservation Tip:

Keep your fireplace damper closed unless a fire is burning. Keeping the damper open is like keeping a window wide open during the winter; it allows warm air to go right up the chimney.





Water Conservation Tip:

Check to see if your faucets have aerators. If they don't, install them! You'll never notice the difference, and you'll cut your sink water consumption in half.
