Reinforce your home's building envelope. The envelope is comprised of the roof/attic, exterior walls, and windows. These materials protect you from the elements.

Attics and exterior walls should have adequate insulation as measured in R units, the unit of measure to indicate the thermal resistance of insulation. It is recommended to have at least R-38 for attics and R-13 for exterior walls for our area of Texas. Homes with pier and beam foundations or mobile homes set on blocks should also have insulation underneath the home.

Windows should be ENERGYSTAR® rated for our area of Texas or certified in all 50 states. ENERGYSTAR® rated windows are typically double paned and filled with gases to lessen radiant heat gain or loss.

Installing insulation or new windows could earn you a 10%-25% rebate on your project costs through BTU's SmartHOME Program. Visit our website to learn more or to apply.

Use weather-stripping and caulk around windows and doors to seal any gaps where air exchanges could occur. This is an easy DIY project with supplies from your local hardware store.

Keep fireplace dampers closed unless you have a fire burning or the embers are still warm. Leaving it open all of the time is equivalent to leaving a window open.

Change your behavior to save a little money.

Set your thermostat to 68°F or lower and even lower while you are away or asleep. Minimize opening outside doors to reduce heat loss.

If your heating unit is a heat pump, never turn the heat up by more than two degrees at a time. This will help to avoid triggering auxiliary heat strips. These heat strips utilize resistance heating, which uses a great deal of energy and costs you money.
