Air Conditioner Filters:

Unplug Electronics When Not in Use:


Not only are multiple cords and plugs unsightly, standby power consumption can add up. Unplug devices or use power strips to easily disconnect multiple electronics when they're not in use.

CONSERVATION TIPS



Replace your old thermostat with an ENERGY STAR® certified programmable thermostat. By controlling your heating and cooling times, it will pay for itself in less than 12 months.





Water Conservation Tip:

When planting a new landscape, create areas with different hydrozones depending on sun/shade exposure, soil and plant types, and types of sprinklers. Be sure to adjust your irrigation system or watering schedule based on those zones' specific needs. This helps you avoid overwatering some areas or underwatering others.
